The Bishops of England and Wales have now decreed that in the light of the reduced dangers of catching or transmitting the coronavirus Holy Communion on the tongue, either standing or kneeling, will now be allowed. If this is how you prefer to share in the Eucharist the Bishops ask you to approach the altar towards the end of Holy Communion as and when everybody else has finished. What is not yet permitted however is reception from the chalice.

To express our devotion and love of the Lord, those of us who are able, like to kneel down. In the interests of Covid security could you please refrain from kneeling if that means being too close to the people in the pew in front of you. Thank you.

FROM FATHER MICHAEL

Synodality is not a word that immediately falls off the tongue. Pope Francis has just announced a synodal process across the whole church – bishops, priests and people dialoguing together, listening together, and planning for the future together – which will culminate in an international synod in Rome in October 2023.

Those of us who have come to the Catholic church from an Anglican background might not be so enamoured with the idea of synods, often exacerbating great divisions within the Church. Pope Francis, on the contrary, wants to avoid the parliamentary model, with the winner takes all kind of mentality. What Pope Francis would appear to be advocating is a listening exercise, a consensus seeking exercise, and a genuine search for spiritual discernment. He wants everyone to play their part. He wants us all to fulfil our vocation as God's Holy People.

All this chimes in very well with what I was suggesting last week – a coming together as a parish for a re-launch in the vaccinated and post lockdown world. Whether the 24th June is going to be feasible remains to be seen. Watch this space.
