FROM FATHER MICHAEL

*Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love.
Send forth your Spirit O Lord and renew the face of the earth.*

Everything comes together at Pentecost. All is chaos and darkness until God breathes His Spirit upon the abyss. The seven days of creation can then begin. Humanity is formed from the dust of the earth and then God breathes into our nostrils the breath of life, and then humanity can become a living being.

The people of Israel are gathered around the mountain of Sinai. God descends upon it in the form of fire and imparts to Moses the ancient Law. The people answer as one "All that the Lord has said, we will do." To this day Jews continue to assemble for Shavuot, the fiftieth day after Passover, to give thanks for the Law and for the first fruits of the harvest.

"When Pentecost day came round" the disciples of the crucified and risen Jesus "had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven.... And something appeared to them like tongues of fire."

The breath of God was again breathing over the chaos and darkness of the world. The New Creation was beginning. Moribund humanity was being renewed. "I shall put my spirit in you, and you will live."

The New Law of Love is completing the Law of Moses in that same fire that appeared on Sinai. People of all races and languages are being gathered into the Church, the new community that God's love is bringing about.

We too celebrate the first fruits of the harvest, the first fruits of liberation, salvation and renewal.

The renewal of our planet, the renewal of humanity, the renewal of the Church, and our feeble attempts to be a community of faith, hope and love, here at St Augustine's, all come together in this wonderful multifaceted celebration that we call Pentecost.
